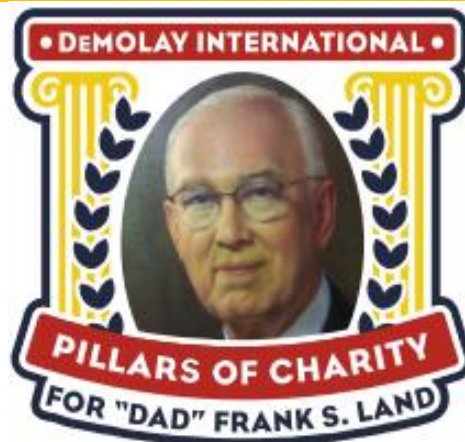


FRANK S. LAND

Honoring the legacy of Dad & Brother Land

DEMOLAY AND SCOTTISH RITE CONNECTION

The legacy of Dad Frank S. Land goes beyond his exemplary commitment to DeMolay. It was his involvement in the Scottish Rite that led to such a natural connection with the organization. The original nine youth first met in the Kansas City Scottish Rite Temple where Dad Land was employed as Social Service Director. The Scottish Rite Adoniram Lodge of Perfection was the first sponsoring organization and appointed the first Advisory Council. Dad Land was honored with the Knight Commander of the Court of Honor of the Scottish Rite and coroneted a 33° in 1925. He received the Grand Cross of the Southern Jurisdiction of the Supreme Council, 33°.

ABOUT THE HOUSE OF THE TEMPLE

Opened in 1915, the House of the Temple functions as the headquarters of the Supreme Council, 33°, Scottish Rite of Freemasonry, Southern Jurisdiction, USA. The Temple houses a library, archives, and museums. The library – the first library open to the public in the District of Columbia – contains books on Freemasonry including history, philosophy, symbolism, and poetry. Other features of the Temple include the Pillars of Charity Alcove, the Executive Chamber, the Hall of Regalia, Hall of Honor and the Pillars of Charity Portrait Gallery. Annually, hundreds of individual visit the House of Temple and explore the history of the Organization.

CAMPAIGN DURATION

July, 2014 – July, 2016. The portrait will be unveiled in 2016 by leadership from DeMolay International and the Supreme Council, 33°, Scottish Rite of Freemasonry, Southern Jurisdiction, USA.
